Maryland Big Tree Program

John Provided the Big Tree Program Report:

October Big Tree Report

CECIL – BT-3667, the county champion umbrella magnolia at Fair Hill NRMA, has been cut down and grass planted. I was notified by a visitor who went to see it.

STATE – **The Big Tree Centennial Contest** – I received two nominations, both from Ashley Simpson and her husband. Both were found in Green Ridge State Forest. The larger of the two was measured at 13' circumference. I understand the Maryland 250 calendar from the Maryland Forest Service has been delayed due to printing issues.

3 trees were measured in October; two privately-owned trees in Frederick and a privately-owned black walnut in Baltimore. The walnut is owned by Edrich Lumber Company, a well-known forest products company. The measurement was done by Dan Rider, Maryland Forest Service.

September was very busy with 43 trees measured/re-measured.
